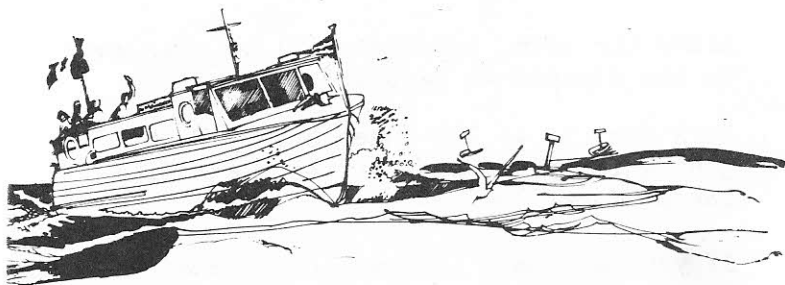

Comments**

While on vacation, my wife and I had occasion to drop into the Port of Newcastle, about 11 miles west of Port Hope. It is still being developed, but there are good moorings, showers, gas, diesel fuel and pump out facilities.

There is a narrow (75 feet) entrance, dredged to about ten feet, bordered by two concrete piers that will eventually be marked by lights, but can now best be recognized from a quarter-mile offshore by a colorful red and blue tent that is used by a small theatre group.

The marina store carries a modest sample of marine supplies, mostly emergency equipment (batteries, cleats, lines etc.) plus some confections and ice.

Considering the early stages of development, the future of this marina looks good.

One of the permanent residents of the marina has applied for a charter to set up a yacht club. But at the moment it's just a dream.

Meanwhile, it's nice to have another spot to visit between here and Port Hope.

Incidentally, they make you feel quite welcome and give good service at reasonable cost.
