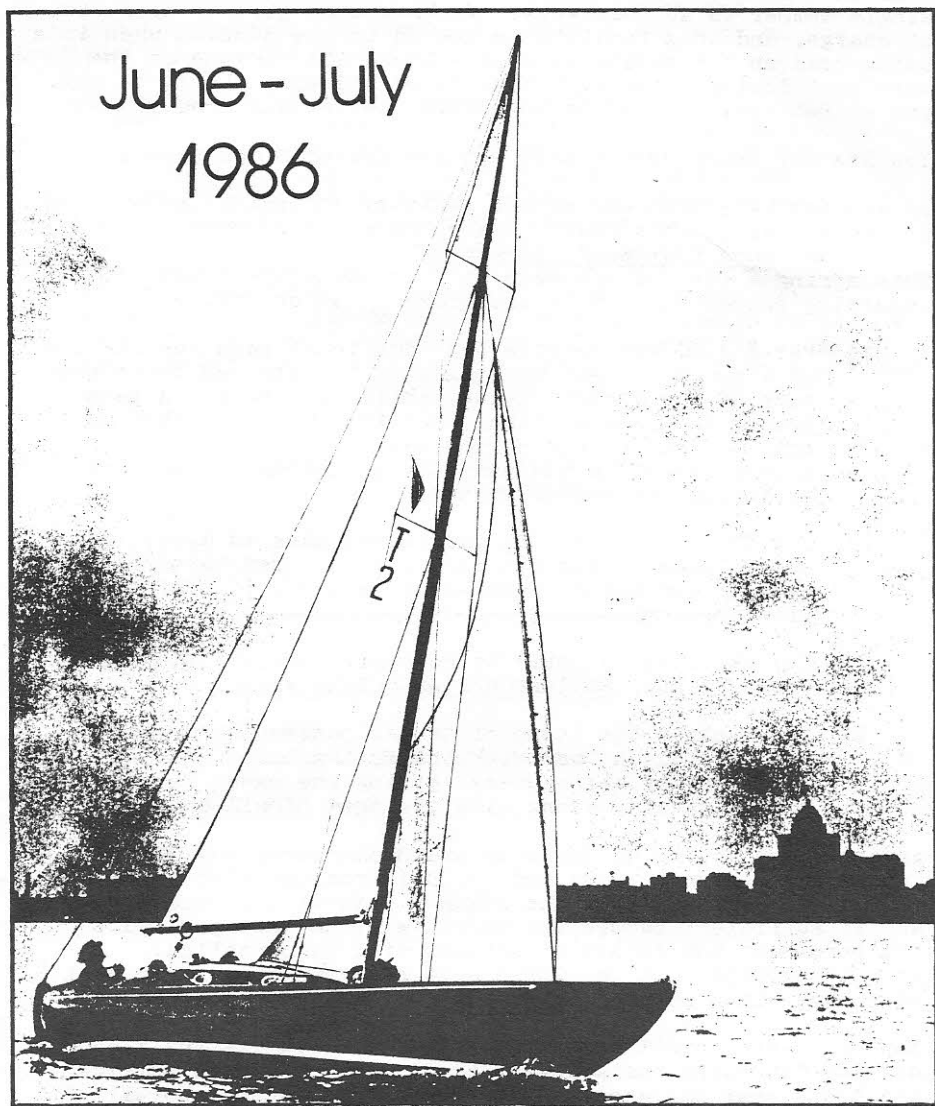

# FLEET CAPTAIN'S REPORT

---

In the last issue I asked for some volunteers to install a head in the ROBBINS. Can you believe I did not hear from one single member to do this work? We have been given a head free of charge, and this facility is needed on the ROBBINS when it's being used on the racing program - looks like anyone on the mark boat during races must have super kidneys. Don't be shy, you secret sanitary marine engineers, let's hear from you.

You are all aware by now that our new driver Simon has departed.

As you may have noticed, we are strictly enforcing the showing of tender passes this year. The rules are very simple: you either show your pass, or you pay. This spring a few members were unclear about the rules regarding passes, so I will summarize them for you.

- 1) For \$50.00 you receive ONE additional pass for the use of a spouse, guest or child. This pass can be in the name of the spouse, guest, child or member. A pass issued in the name other than that of the member can only be used by the person named on the pass. A pass issued in the name of the member can be used by anyone the member wishes.
- 2) For \$75.00 you get ONE additional pass as described above, plus passes for all your children between the ages of two and fifteen as of December 31st of the previous year.
- 3) The above rules apply to Honorary, Senior, Dinghy, Intermediate, Student and Associate members only.
- 4) To simplify the issue of tender passes, next year we will include a form with the spring billing to be completed by all members, giving the names required on the passes, along with the ages of all children.

We are going to try on Saturday and Sunday only a 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. run ( 16.30 and 17.30 ) from the club to try to relieve congestion on the QUEEN. This will be monitored and if sufficient people use it, it will be incorporated in the permanent schedule. If not, it will be cancelled. Both the ROBBINS and the QUEEN have been running fairly well, with some minor setbacks. Hopefully these have been cured.

Now on to electrical work: Saturday, June 14 is the kick-off day for extending the power on the American Side to service the boats near the Ward's ferry dock. You people who will be receiving this service are expected to be at the club to help, and at the York Street slip, 8:30 a.m., to load materials. Bring hand tools.

We have a new member in the club called John Hogbin who is an electrician. He has been busy every Saturday at the club, with the assistance of Norrie McDonald. Belonging to Queen City is like having a large extended family, it's a warm place to belong to and is populated by great people with a great diversity of thought as to what is best for the Club. This causes many disagreements and factions in the Club, but as in any family this should end and everyone pull together to make Queen City a better place to sail, race and cruise from and to party at, so remember, whether you moor on the American Side or the Club Side, it's all one Club.

As you are aware, we will be holding a Harbour License test at the club. To date there are thirtyseven people on the list. Please check with Anita in the office to ensure your name is on the master list, and to receive your literature and application form from her. Some people who spoke to me expressing interest may have caught me at a bad time when I did not have the list with me, so may not be on it. To make sure you are, please check, we don't want to disappoint anyone. Bill Hewitt has volunteered to co-ordinate this project - thanks, Bill. He will be phoning you when we have a date set - it will most likely be on a Tuesday or Thursday evening. We will post notices when the date has been confirmed.
