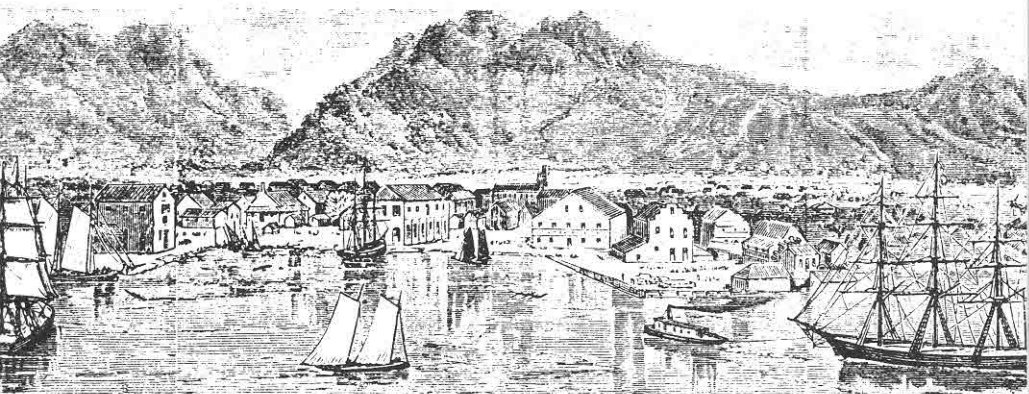

### Sailpast and Salute

Yachts are requested to sail past the Commodore's yacht "BORN FREE II" and continue one boat length beyond. Where possible, the skipper and the entire crew should stand and face the Commodore. The commodore will return the yacht's salute with a hand salute.

### Dispersal

After sailing past, yachts are requested to proceed in a NW direction to clear the Sailpast area.

Note: RCYC's Sailpast is also being held in the bay on May 16. Please stay clear of the RCYC Sailpast area as indicated on the enclosed chart.

### Dressing Ship

Yachts are requested to dress ship when they return to their moorings.

### Rig-of-the-Day

Blazer and white trousers (both for the actual Sailpast and the evening's events).

And, if we are all still able, Sunday, the 17th, QCYC will host the Blake Van Winkle Trophy Race.

### Blake Van Winkle Trophy Race - Sunday, May 17th

Each year, Queen City is the host of the opening event of the Interclub (LORC) racing season: The Blake Van Winkle - to honour a Commodore of our Club who was well known in racing circles.

# JUNIOR CLUB

Now is the time to enroll for this year's Junior Club Program. An application form is attached as part of this Clipper.

From the early indications there will be a full house again this year and applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Applications must be accompanied by a cheque. In past years some junior club members have arrived on the first day of the session, application in hand. This year that procedure may result in the student not being accepted if there is full enrollment. So be warned and enroll early.

Dates for Junior Club are as follows:

Session One - July 6 to July 31

Session Two - August 3 to August 28

Junior Club Banquet - August 30

Fees are \$225 for members' children and \$275 for non members' children for each session. All students must pay full fees for each session attended whether or not they can attend all weeks of the session.

The format will be much the same as last year. We plan to rig a few albacores with spinnakers and trapeze to teach these skills from a more stable platform than the Laser II's. We have acquired another instructor boat and now have three boats (if the oldest boat can be coaxed into floating for another year). This will enable the instructors to provide more attention to each level and to the individuals within the levels.

Cork is August 20 to 28, 1987, and features the Cork Youth Festival from Thursday, August 20, to Sunday, August 23, with racing the following week. We plan to attend again this year.

There will be the regular events - Parents Night with, we hope, slightly less wind this year - the camp outs, where 30 or so eat for 80 - and the regular regattas and races around the harbour. A detailed list will be published later.

Finally, I cannot stress too much that the program emphasizes that sailing is fun. We hope your children enjoy it as well as learn something about sailing. We look forward to seeing you this summer.
