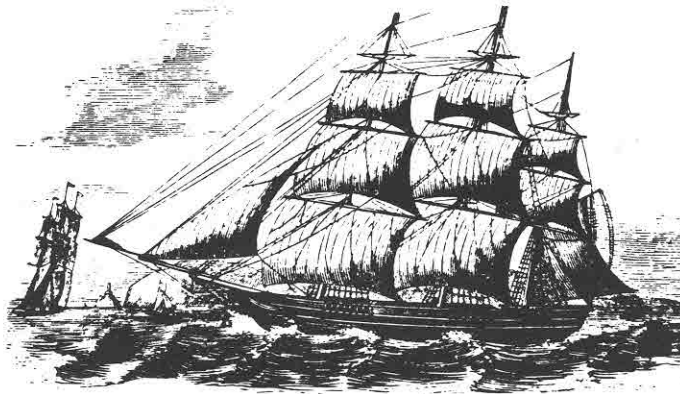

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Club's 1988 budget was approved at the April 19th meeting with a few revisions based on suggestions from Board members. It is now up to the individual chairmen to work within their respective accounts.

Details of yard clean-up and other work parties were reviewed and materials were arranged. The fence at the front of the Clubhouse will be removed and replaced with a small flower garden. A proper bicycle rack is to be located near the dinghy shed to avoid storage of bikes against the Clubhouse building.

As reciprocal cards are received from around the lake, we were prompted to clarify our own guest mooring policy. QCYC's 1988 policy will be as follows:

1. First two nights free of charge to reciprocal club members.

4. Pumpout will be available for visitors use at a charge of \$5.00.
5. All monies will be payable to the office or bar staff.

And, due to popular request, extension of Friday night bar hours is currently under review.


