It's spring! All winter we have been anticipating its arrival just for the chance to strain our backs, spend our money and wish we sailed a boat that didn't take so much waxing and bottom paint.

For me, its been getting to know my position and trying to anticipate problems once our boats were launched. This will be the second year I have the pleasure of serving on the board. I can not remember writing a report that has not included the name Norrie Macdonald

Thanks to to Norrie the *Robbins* was launched March 18th, one week early. To accomplish that he gave up three weekends of his time along with numerous hours in the city repairing the shaft, rudder and steering control. Thanks Norrie.

THE BERTH AT THE FOOT OF YORK ST. IS SECURED.

In the last issue of Clipper, it seems. I confused a number of members when I said "the berth at the foot of York St. was not secured at this time!" You may have read in the newspaper that there has been some dramatic changes and budget cuts at Harbourfront. It was because of these changes that negotiations could not begin until March. In addition to this, I have approached Harbourfront for a 15 year lease. In order to insure we do not get pushed out by charter boats or other interests.

Bikes aboard the *Queen* has been an issue over the last few years. My position on this is "yes" bikes will be allowed on the *Queen*, but only on the rear sun deck, not on the roof. At times, on a race or at peek times when the *Queen* is running full, I

expect the member(s) with a bike to wait or make other arrangements.

The regular tender schedule began Monday, April 15th, 1991. The adult guest fare is \$2.00, GST included. All passengers not carrying a tender pass are expected to pay this cash fare. Members will receive a voucher signed by the driver. This voucher can be redeemed at the club office when accompanied by a tender pass. The drivers will be asking to see passes, so have them ready when you board.

Now your boat is floating and looking new again, a few things to remember during the sailing season:

- 1. Oil level in crankcase.
- 2. Intake filter, we now we have a new enemy, ZEBRA mussels.

- 3. Filters, diesel and gas. Remember when you fill up, you pay for the fuel, but the grit, sand and water is free.
- 4. Batteries, check the terminal and water level from time to time.
- 5. Thru hull fittings, make sure the shut off valves are working.
- 6. Running light on the boat and/or the mast, make sure they are in working order.
- 7. VHF, check connections and its transmission, have you got your radio station license?
- 8. Harbour license, keep it with you.
