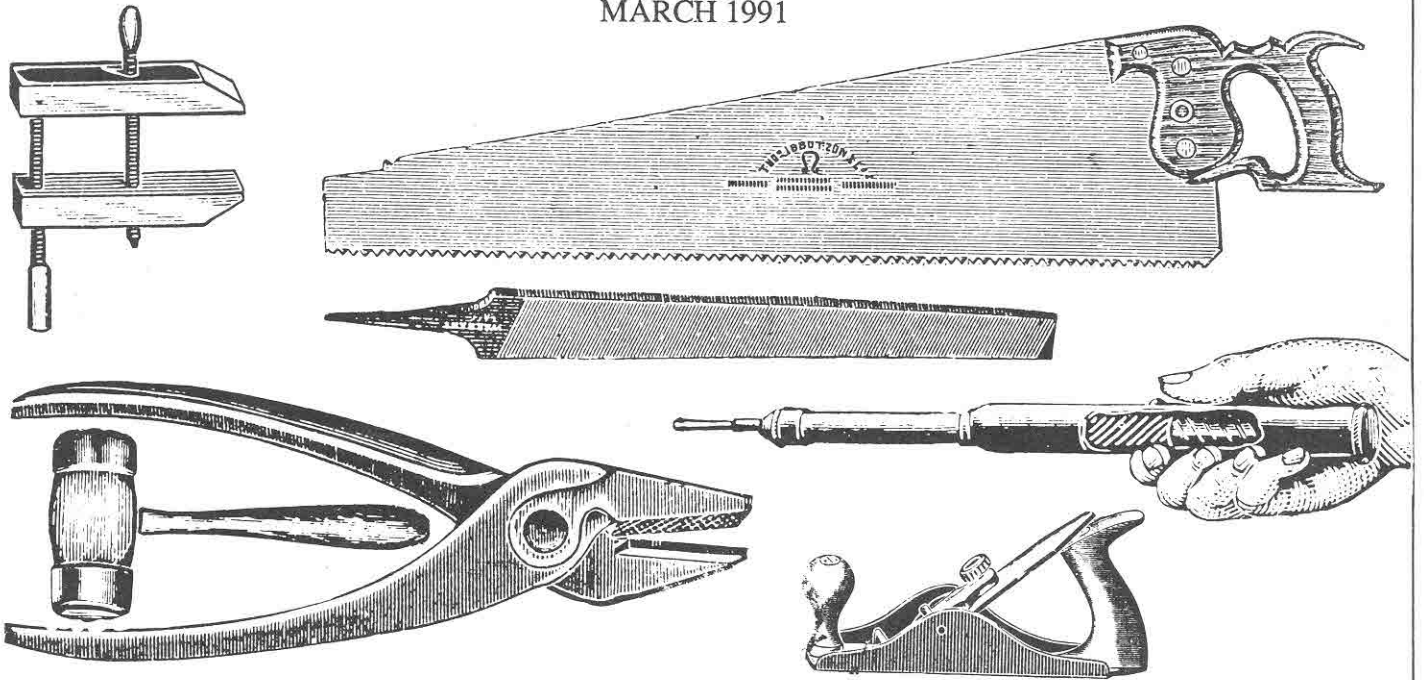

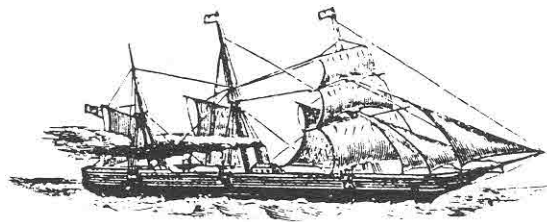

By the time you read this, hopefully you will have enjoyed Doc Campbell's March 1st QCYC ski day and we have shown ABYC how to play volleyball at our Sail-in on Saturday, March 2nd. Thank you, Doc and Norman, for arranging these traditional events.

Speaking of ABYC, a small but determined group of members "cornered" Pat and me there last month. The dining room was full with Pat's old "Beach's Ski Club" members enjoying the every Wednesday Italian Dinner after a hard day on the slopes.

I understand the food was very good. ABYC outnumbered us at the bar, but, by golly, we closed it.

Among a variety of topics discussed, we talked about flag and sailing etiquette and about our Sailpast which will be on May 18th. With some good weather,

this should be a dressy day on the water and a command performance for all members to participate. If memory serves, on a good day we get about seventy or eighty boats out--not much over half of our fleet of over one hundred and thirty. Mark this date now in your calendar and be there, please.

Board members currently are coping with the preparation of budgets and we will be reporting in detail at the Spring "Information" Meeting. In the meantime we are carefully conserving our cash considering the rather tight economy and a number of projects under consideration by Planning Chairman Ray Shepherd and necessary repairs. In this regard, during the latter half of March and in April, we intend to examine the east window wall of the restaurant section by section and replace any rotting members (did I actually say

that?-strike members for timbers.) Once necessary repairs are made, the wall will be restored exactly as is with the exception that it will be solid without the louvred screens and inward hinging doors on the lower half.

The snug bar has been well used this winter thanks to Brian Duff, our erstwhile bartender cum winter security guard, who has cleaned it and most importantly had the coffee ready. House Chairman Bill Eckersley and others have a variety of good ideas on how it might be used and furnished. Suffice it to say that for now we are simply going to install the baseboards, cover the bare wood trim with a natural finish (to protect it and to keep our options open) and put up blinds of some sort. Over the course of this summer we can determine how the snug bar can best be used and plan to furnish

it accordingly. Give your ideas to Bill or Ray. Don't be bashful.

Thanks go to many members for bringing the snug bar to its present state: Ted Moore for construction, Jimmy McKinlay for electrical, Ray Shepherd for finishing the bathroom and for the dart board, Fred Mayerhofer for the kitchen counter, Thomas King for loaning his refrigerator, Norm Dilworth for the bathroom mirror and lights, Brian Duff for computer golf, several members for pictures. I know I've left people out. Thanks, everyone!

Another concern is what to do with the "storage" area between the snug bar and the lobby. We're thinking about where best to store the extra tables and chairs (maybe right there). A variety of ideas have been suggested so you can watch for more on this. Whatever, my concern is that we make best use of

existing facilities without further major capital expense at this time.

The Centennial Book is in the final phase. It promises to be a keeper, but we are reconsidering how many we should print-for posterity, etc. Some are very optimistic that members will want more than one copy-at \$50 plus each? I don't know. If you think you will want to buy an extra copy or have reasons for printing extra, please let Karl McManaman or Brian King know right away.

It's time again to issue our reciprocity cards to other yacht clubs. For as long as I can remember, our policy has been to give two nights free mooring to reciprocal club visitors. This year, however, we will have a two-tier policy. Our regular policy will continue to apply to those clubs that reciprocate in

the same manner. Other clubs will be treated as we are treated by them. We are also pruning the list. If you were refused free accommodation last year or otherwise treated badly, please let JB or me know. To quote Gib Speight: "We give what we get!" We are also asking visitors to fly burgees and to show membership cards.

During the past several months, many members have called to discuss ideas and express concerns. This is very much appreciated. Keep those calls and letters coming, please.

The next meeting of the very exclusive CORNER THE COMMODE will be at ABYC again. Same day of the month: Wednesday the 21st, but in March-at ABYC. This time, let's go in time for dinner.

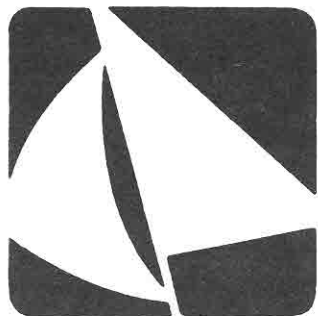
