Writing through his secretary, Sir James promised that the matter should be laid before the Cabinet at an early date.

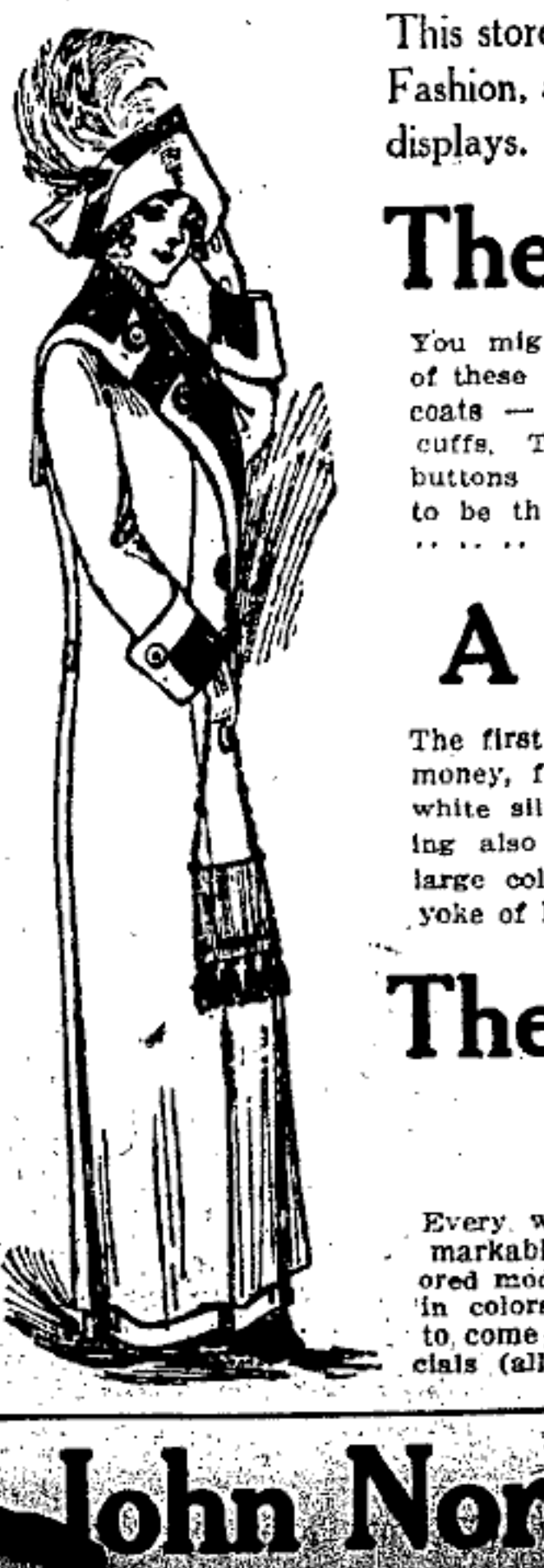
